SHORT BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Naureen Shaikh completed triple Honors Degrees in Biology, Anthropology-Zoology, and Religious Studies at University of Michigan. She earned her MD from Rush College of Medicine in Chicago, and graduated from Tufts University Family Practice Program in Boston where she did additional training in Complementary Medicine. Dr. Shaikh received her fellowship form the AAFP. She completed a miniMBA program through the SBA Interise program. She published research and received teaching awards from Tufts University, the University of Chicago, the University of Michigan, and the University of California San Francisco and Stanford. Dr. Shaikh created the San Francisco Bay Area's first integrative health Center accepting of all insurance and having cured 1500 patients "Syndrome X" patients with lifestyle modification practices to normal blood pressure, lipids and glycohemoglobin for over one year without medications. Dr Shaikh is involved in launching the west coasts patient integrating precision medicine center. She is a member of Rotary International active in Global Grant Projects. Receiving local and national awards, Naureen is public speaker and featured on national radio and in newspapers.

Dr. Shaikh founded Mobile Medical Team International, a public charity providing medical education and relief to underserved populations internationally. MMTI has grown 30% financially annually for the past decade. Projects include a hospital clinic in Africa; support missions after Pakistan's earthquake and flood disasters; creating medical education games targeting malnutrition, infectious disease and family planning for four continents; developing an international financial transparency web-portal for institutions and donors involved in humanitarian relief; therapeutic childcare for traumatized children, and home therapy for uninsured disabled children and adults.

Naureen transitioned from treating and curing disease 1 patient at a time; to 40,000 at a time in her Bay Area Public Health work; to 250,000 in Tanzania's fastest growing urban slum with a "net zero health campus under development; to 2 Million through her Diffusion medical education portal with our Facebook/ Internet.org partner. Dr. Shaikh is a global leader in human centered design and a regular participant at innovation, technology and global health forums.

LONG BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Naureen Shaikh was born in Detroit Michigan. Naureen is the 24th physician and 45th business professional in her family. She grew up in rural blue collar Michigan, loves horses and the country. As a teenager she waitressed, and candy-striped in the local emergency room where she met her first patient who had an after death experience. She also worked as a research assistant in the hospital's laboratory. At the age of 13 years old, Naureen moved away from her family to pursue higher education as an art recruit at the preparatory school, Detroit Country Day School, renowned for its former student Robin Williams. Naureen played first string on state championship teams in varsity soccer and varsity tennis. She was the International Thespian Society Chapter President and was active in theater production. Naureen together with Chris Weber represented their high school at the state's inter-racial forum. Naureen participated in model United Nations. Her first research publication in a peer reviewed medical journal was in cellular and molecular biology at the age of 16.

She was one of a handful of students invited to be a board member of the University of Michigan's Program in the Sciences and the Humanities Multidisciplinary Understanding group. Naureen worked in immune-dermatology research, published and participated in grant writing throughout her undergraduate years. Naureen graduated with triple Honors degrees in Biology, Anthropology-Zoology and Studies in Religion from the University of Michigan. During her undergraduate years she also served at the United Way Dawn Farm Rehabilitation Agency and was a rally coordinator and fundraiser for the National Women's Coalition. During her college years, Naureen had her first tropical medicine experience in Pakistan at Fatima Jinnah Hospital.

Naureen received her medical degree from Chicago's Rush College of Medicine. She found her participation in the select Alternative Curriculum and her rotations at Cook County Hospital to be particularly helpful later in life when she began her international medical work. It was during an assignment to a primary care public health project in the slums of Chicago, that Naureen changed from her surgical track, where she was top of her class, to primary care. During medical school, she danced at the Chicago Multicultural Dance center, formerly the Bryant Ballet. She continued to publish in immune-dermatology through the University of California San Francisco.

Naureen received her top rank choice and attended Boston's Tufts Family Practice Medicine Program. She was the principal investigator for a national hospital research study on febrile children. After a trying experience with a newborn, Naureen began her work in palliative care for newborns and for adults. Naureen educated patients and residents of palliative care and end of life issues and resources. Having targeted Marin California as her next move, Naureen rotated through a local hospital and created their palliative care protocols. Naureen spear-headed her residency's first morbidity and mortality rounds. Naureen also rotated through the University of Chicago's Department of Family Medicine as Principal Investigator for a multivariate analysis of a diabetic medicine at the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. Also during her residency, she rotated through the Sharewood Project, offering free clinics in Boston, and was an elected Board Member of the Massachusetts Academy of Family Physicians Public Relations Committee. Naureen received awards for teaching from Tufts University School of Medicine both of her residency years. Naureen published her first book chapter in a primary care reference book. Naureen pursued additional training in Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynecology (performing over 300 deliveries), Aryuvedic practice and the then termed "complementary alternative medicine."

Naureen then moved to Marin California and launched her first business: the San Francisco Bay Area's first insurance charging Integrative Health and Wellness center, which was in the black within 30 days and has grown over the past decade. She received teaching awards for every year she taught at Stanford's School of Medicine. For over a decade Naureen has served on a Board of Directors of the local Independent Physician's Association and now also Accountable Care Organization in the North Bay of San Francisco, most of that time being the only woman, person under 50 and minority on the board. She created the Interim Behavioral Health Program which provides covered mental health services and coordination by direct primary care physician referral for the first time in 25 years in the Bay area. Naureen also serves on the Board of Directors for the local

Federal Qualified Health Center. Naureen served as Department Chair of Medicine at Marin General Hospital. She continues to teach and conduct clinical research and write. Naureen received her fellowship degree from the American Academy of Family Physicians. She was awarded Doctor of the year for her county by the American Board for Family Medicine in 2013, and won the national Vital's Patient's Choice Award in 2014. Naureen competed her miniMBA program in 2016 under a SBA scholarship for the Interise program.

After being invited by Columbia University Medical Center to participate in a project in Africa, Naureen founded Mobile Medical Team International, a non-government 501c3 public charity providing medical education and relief to underserved populations locally and internationally. Programs include ongoing support of a hospital clinic in Tanzania since 2006; support missions after Pakistan's earthquake and flood disasters; creating medical education games targeting malnutrition, infectious disease and family planning for four continents; developing an international financial transparency program for institutions and donors involved in humanitarian relief; the state's first full time therapeutic childcare center for traumatized and transitioning children ages birth to six years old; and developing the Bay Area's first outpatient and home physical and occupational therapy for disabled children and adults with Medicaid. MMTI was a Skoll Global Threats grant recipient in 2012. MMTI has over one hundred partners including other NGO's, for profit organizations and city, state, county, federal and international divisions of governments.

Dr. Shaikh is a member of Rotary International and with recent involvement in the Polio Plus Program's eradication efforts. She is a member of the national Collaboration on Health and the Environment. Naureen has presented and spoken at many forums and conferences. Naureen was featured on national radio show, "Do the Dream" which also featured Deepak Chopra. She has been highlighted in dedicated newspaper articles and press releases. Naureen enjoys teaching, traveling, ballet, painting and drawing, reading, gardening, mountain and beach running, music, and above all her children. She speaks some French, Urdu, and Spanish and both formally and ongoing studies medieval languages and texts. Naureen studies and intends to enter global government.
